Dramaturg's Notes for A Christmas Carol 2024 By Linda Scheufler

Charles Dickens (1812–1870) brings us into the bustling heart of London during the Industrial Revolution, where the city is growing in every direction. New technologies, railways, and migrants from England and Ireland are transforming London into a crowded metropolis. African people, newly arrived, are part of this changing scene. By 1800, London's Black population was estimated at around 20,000, many working in households as footmen, coachmen, and cooks, supporting the city's wealthy families. Yet London, for all its hustle and bustle, struggles under a cloud of coal smog, poor sanitation, and disease-challenges faced by rich and poor alike.

A Christmas Carol is one of Dickens's most famous social commentaries, shaped by his dedication to helping those in need. Dickens's own family hardships and his father's time in debtors' prison left him with a lifelong mission to shed light on the struggles of the working poor. People in London, desperate to survive, took any job they could find—even one paying a mere 15 shillings a week. With bread costing 7.5 pence per loaf, a week's wages could barely stretch to feed a family. A skilled tradesman might earn 20 shillings, but without social services, a single illness or job loss could spell disaster, and even

prison wasn't far off. Dickens understood this deeply, having been sent to work in

a boot polish factory when his father was imprisoned.

In A Christmas Carol, we meet Bob Cratchit, a poor but hardworking clerk at "Marley and Scrooge Counting House"—a firm lending and borrowing money for London's bustling shipping industry. Ebenezer Scrooge's clients range from the wealthy to the struggling, and his restless drive for profit leads to high interest rates and little sympathy. Christmas Eve

arrives, and Cratchit asks for a rare day off. Scrooge, always focused on success, reluctantly agrees—but this night marks the anniversary of his late partner, Jacob Marley's, death.

That night, Marley's ghost appears in Scrooge's dark bedchamber, bound in chains of his own making, and warns of three coming visitors: the Ghosts of Christmas Past, Present, and Future. Marley, bearing the weight of his own regrets, hopes to spare Scrooge from the

same fate of torment and isolation, where profit eclipsed compassion.

Through each spirit, Scrooge sees his life's decisions laid bare—a lonely childhood, a hopeful apprenticeship, a lost love, and finally, the bleak future of a lonely death. The ghosts' revelations speak to us, too, reminding us of the power our choices hold.

As Christmas approaches, Dickens's message of kindness and reflection remains timeless. May the story of Scrooge inspire you and your family to share warmth,

kindness, and perhaps even a bit of holiday

magic this season. Merry Christmas!
